DETAILS OF POLLING AT THE KURWONGBAH BY-ELECTION HELD ON 24 MAY 1997

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Introduction

On 28 April 1997 Her Excellency, the Governor, issued the writ for a by-election for the electoral district of Kurwongbah to fill the vacancy in Parliament following the resignation of Mrs M R Woodgate.

This is the second by-election during the term of the 48th Parliament, following Lytton in October 1996 (Mundingburra 1996 is classified as a **new** election) and the 369th for the Queensland Parliament since 1860.

Mrs Linda Lavarch (A.L.P.) won the Kurwongbah By-Election on preferences (fifth count) on 24 May 1997 with a majority, following the full distribution of preferences of 3,884 or 60.20% of the two party preferred vote.

The scope and detail of this report has been extended as a service to stakeholders and clients. Changes to counting procedures now make possible the calculation of two party preferred percentages by polling booth and vote type. Also presented for the first time are data drawn from the election night, notional, two candidate preferred count which shows distributions of preferences and rates of exhaustion for individual candidates.





The Kurwongbah By-Election was won on preferences at the 5th count (bold horizontal line) by the A.L.P. candidate (Lavarch) who secured 60.20% of the Two Party Preferred Vote. This table summarises the distribution of preferences and rates of exhaustion of votes cast for the five (5) candidates excluded during the full preferential count.

The percentage of "Live Votes at each Exclusion" calculated for each excluded candidate is that candidate's share of the total votes remaining in the count **before** exclusion. It would be misleading to total these figures as if they were all percentages of first preference votes because there would be some double-counting.

The final row shows the division between Rankin (41.29%) and Lavarch (23.24%) of the 5,672 primary votes (26.94% of total formal) cast for the five (5) excluded candidates, together with the overall rate of exhaustion (35.47%).

Data here are derived from the election night, notional, Two Candidate Preferred Count. This analysis avoids the multiple counting of ballot papers required by the full preferential count as presented above in Table (3).

The final row shows the division between Rankin (42.08%) and Lavarch (23.10%) of the 5,311 ordinary primary votes (27.73% of formal ordinary votes) cast for the five excluded candidates, together with the overall rate of exhaustion (34.81%). The bottom line differs from the results of Table (3) because the election night, notional count omits Declaration and Pre-Poll votes, in this case a total 361 extraordinary votes cast for the five (5) excluded candidates.

The Two Party Preferred (TPP) statistic indicates the division of support for the A.L.P. on the one hand and the National/Liberal coalition on the other. TPP percentages are calculated from the base of votes remaining in the count (total formal minus exhausted votes).

Ballot papers have been initially ascribed to candidates according to first preference votes. TPP percentages have been calculated by investigation of the distribution of later preferences on these ballot papers to either the A.L.P. or Liberal candidates. Exhausted votes have been removed from the count.

Data here are derived from the election night, notional, two candidate preferred count conducted by polling booth officials, supplemented by a special notional count of Declaration and Pre-Poll Votes. The final row includes the primary vote for Lavarch (A.L.P.) and Rankin (Liberal), and provides overall TPP percentages by polling booth and vote type.
